A joint 5th SCORAI, 21st ERSCP, and Wageningen University Conference



Teaching and Learning Sustainable Consumption - A Guidebook

This is an outcome of a major book project that many KAN members contributed to and that Marlyne Sahakian and Daniel Fischer as KAN core members co-edited (together with 3 other colleagues). The guidebook "Teaching and Learning Sustainable Consumption" will be published by Routledge on 8 May 2023. It contains introductory background chapters on basics of teaching and learning sustainable consumption, as well as more than 50 innovative teaching examples from around the world.


Circular Economy WG
